A **UAV is an Unmanned Aerial Vehicle** and these are also known as remotely piloted aircraft (RPA's), and sometimes commonly as 'drones'. These aircraft come in all shapes and sizes and can be used for purposes such as *firefighting, search and rescue, disaster relief, border patrol, weather monitoring, hurricane tracking and law enforcement*. In fact, the Queensland Police recently launched two new UAV's to assist them in various operations.

Remotely piloted aircraft can be used in many ways, and importantly, the tasks that they can fulfill do not put its pilot at risk. This kind of work might suit someone who loves the outdoors and has good hand-eye coordination. You might like to work as part of a team, or it has the potential for you to eventually own your own company, working for yourself and possibly employing others.

To become a certified UAV Operator to work commercially, you first need to hold a qualification, delivered by a CASA (Civil Aviation Safety Authority) fully approved organisation. The training towards a 'UAV Controller Certificate' is heavy on general aviation theory and typically a little lighter on the practical training. The training towards a 'Remote Pilot Licence' on the other hand is very specific to RPAS and more evenly balanced in both theory & practical content. Once you have your UAV/UAS/RPAS pilot licence you are eligible to work for the holder of a UAV Operator Certificate, or you can apply for a UAV Operator Certificate yourself.

Career in Audiology



Audiology is a health care profession involved in assessing, managing and rehabilitating **hearing loss** and **balance disorders**. Audiology is a rapidly growing profession and qualified audiologists are in high demand both locally and internationally. To become an audiologist students usually have to complete a bachelor degree in *linguistics, physics, psychology, special education, speech pathology, science or a related discipline*, followed by a graduate diploma and a master's degree in audiology. **La Trobe University** offers a **Bachelor of Health Sciences/Master of Audiology** with VCE requirements of Units 3 and 4: a study score of at least 30 in English (EAL) or at least 25 in English other than EAL; and a study score of at least 25 in two of Biology, Chemistry, any Mathematics, Physical Education or Physics.

The required ATAR for 2015 entry was 85.90.

Career as an Auslan Interpreter



The **Job Guide** indicates that *interpreters use their knowledge of languages and cultures to convert a spoken or signed language into another spoken or signed language, usually within a limited time frame and in the presence of the participants who need to communicate.*

Interpreters may perform the following tasks:

- interpret verbal or signed communications between two parties
- provide interpretations of conversations or speeches
- express the meaning and feeling of what is said or signed in another language in the appropriate tone and style within a range of settings
- verbally translate written texts

Auslan interpreters facilitate communication between deaf (or hard of hearing) and hearing people. They can be employed in a wide range of everyday settings – banks, legal meetings, hospitals, schools, TAFEs, universities, retail stores – and work in supporting effective communication.
